For the past several decades, visual storytellers have been pushing boundaries and exploring different ways to share their stories. Comics memoir and autobiography can be found everywhere these days: as webcomics, zines, and books. Laura Knetzger (*Bug Boys*), Shing Yin Khor, (*The American Dream? A Journey on Route 66*), Taki Soma (*Sleeping While Standing*), and Sally Madden (*Snack Diary*), have all shared their own life experiences in comics form, and will examine the process, rewards, and challenges of translating one's life into comics.

12:00 p.m.-**12:45** p.m. Working on Big IP. What's it like working with some of the biggest publishers in the world, on some of the most well know (and loved) characters and properties? We'll find out by asking those who've done it! Guest creators Stephanie Williams (*Moon Girl & Devil Dinosaur*), Jorge Corona (*Batgirls*), Joëlle Jones (*Batman*), Soo Lee (*Cheetara*), Morgan Beem (*Swamp Thing*), and Adrian Ropp (*Disney Infinity*) will talk about the thrill of being asked to create for fan-favorite characters, the challenges, and why it can also be a bit daunting.

Justin Zimmerman, and artist Aaron McConnell will explore the history of Battle Quest and share what the future has in store.

3:00 p.m.-3:45 p.m. Queer Horror. Queer Horror is a rising subgenre in horror fiction, telling terrifying stories from new perspectives. What is Queer Horror? How does it differ from traditional horror? What truths does it reveal about the queer experience? And is all horror actually queer horror at root? Join our panelists – Soo Lee (*CARMILLA: The First Vampire*), Ashley Robin Franklin (*The Hills of Estrella Roja*), Rye Hickman (*The Harrowing*), and Emily C. Martin (*Progressively Horrified* podcast) for a discussion of these questions and others, as well as spotlights on essential works of the genre.

To explore how they make it from mind to page, we've assembled an all-star lineup of stellar comics writers. They'll discuss their creative process, the challenges they face, and why they've chosen comics as a career. As the "unofficial sequential art historian of the Gem State," he has given many presentations on the history of comic books in Idaho. Jones has worked on titles such as *Batman*, *Wonder Woman*, and *Catwoman* for DC Comics and *Ms. Marvel*, *Spider-Woman*, and *The Scarlet Witch* for Marvel Comics. Jones created the new Wonder Girl character for DC Comics and made her a Boise native, just like her creator.
